Membership has several benefits:

-Our SCA website will soon have links to more and more-useful information.

-Our SCA LinkedIn page provides information you choose to share with others.

-Our member directory allows us to find friends with whom we've lost contact.

-Members may sponsor family members for post-high school scholarships.

-Members get notice of fellow members who have recently passed away.

-Our biennial reunion is a source of MSC & AMEDD updates and camaraderie.

So, what can we current members do about recruiting and retention?



Member Services

Well, our reunion is over and hopefully everyone who traveled is home safe. For those of you who did not attend for one reason or another, I encourage you to start planning now to make the next one. Once the dates and location are finalized, you will read about it in a future issue of the SCA E-News.

Speaking of the SCA E-News, the only way to guarantee you get each copy is to be sure we have your current email address on file and the easiest way to do that is to make necessary changes to your SCA profile yourself. As a SCA member in good standing, you have access to your electronic profile on the SCA web page via the Member Services page. Once you connect to the SCA web page (<u>http://silvercaduceusassociation.com</u>) simply click on the Member Services button at the top center of the page and then click on the Log In Now! link located about one third down the page. From here just follow the directions that appear under the title, Welcome to Member Services. Once logged in, click on View Your Profile located in the top right corner of the page. Now you can make changes to your password, postal address, email address, phone numbers, etc. Once you have made the changes click on the Save Information button located in the bottom left corner of the page.

Also, while you are updating your profile, take a look at what is currently checked off in the **Viewing Preferences** line at the bottom of the page in the **Ad-ditional Information** box. This is the information you have allowed other SCA members to view when they log in and are scrolling through the member list. When built, the individual profiles are designed to disclose just the member's rank, name and role in the SCA (i.e. Regular or Life Member, Board, Officer, etc.). To release more information, members need to make the changes themselves by checking off the items they want to be viewed (i.e. Address, Email, Phone Numbers and Spouse). We encourage everyone to at least add in their email address to allow other members to reach out to them. As a reminder, only our SCA members in good standing have access to the members list.

As the Membership Committee Chairman, I recommend all members review their web page profile annually, at a minimum and make changes as necessary. Remember, the most important piece of information is your email address. Keep this current and you will always be connected. Our Association is now represented on LinkedIn as the Silver Caduceus Association Group. LinkedIn is a secure professional networking WEB site for people in professional occupations now or retired. Founded in December 2002, LinkedIn has more than 200 million users in more than 200 countries and territories.

As a member of the Group you will be able to enjoy the benefits of initiating discussions, post and search for jobs, share topics of importance to the SCA and keep in touch with other Group members. Communicating through the Group will also give us another method of instantly communicating with our SCA members.

If you are already a LinkedIn member, then all you need to do to become a member of the SCA LinkedIn group is to login to LinkedIn and go to the search window and type in " Silver Caduceus Association" and ask to join the group. Once that is done, the Group Moderator, Jim Vinci, who initiated and developed the Group, will receive your request and immediately process it to make you a Group Member and give you access.

If you are not currently part of LinkedIn, then you will first need to register on LinkedIn and then you can follow the process as outlined in the previous paragraph to get on the Group.

To post an article, start a discussion or comment on a discussion on our SCA LinkedIn site the following steps are recommended:

- 1. Sign in to LinkedIn
- 2. Click on "Interests" in the top dock which is a black header and choose "Groups"
- 3. Click on "My Groups" in the blue dock under the dock described in #2 above
- 4. Click on "SCA"
- 5. Click on "Enter a conversation title ... "
- 6. Type your title of article, post or discussion in the first window
- 7. Type your discussion or post in the second window
- 8. Go to the extreme right side of the page when finish and click on "POST"

To comment on an article or discussion already posted:

- 1. Sign in to LinkedIn
- 2. Click on "Interests" in the top dock which is a black header and choose "Groups"
- 3. Click on "My Groups" in the blue dock under the dock described in #2 above
- 4. Click on "SCA"

5. Choose the discussion, article or previous post which you wish to comment, by scrolling down through the various post

- 6. Click on "comment"
- 7. Type your comment in the window that appears
- 8. Go to the extreme right side of the page when finish and click on "POST"
